

CLME+ SAP Monitoring & Evaluation Workshop

Cartagena, Colombia
30 - 31 January, 2018

OVER-ARCHING OBJECTIVE

The over-arching objective for this workshop is to give continuation to the collaborative SAP M&E Framework development process (which was initiated by the CLME+ PCU in 2017), in order to consolidate the formal component of the M&E framework and to achieve its endorsement (by the countries that endorsed the CLME+ SAP) and adoption & operationalization (by the CLME+ SAP ICM Member Organizations and Secretariat) within the shortest possible timeframe.

GENERAL WORKSHOP OBJECTIVE

The general workshop objective is to jointly advance, as much as possible during the workshop itself, the development, and pre-endorsement at the level of the CLME+ SAP ICM membership, of a “*formal framework for SAP Monitoring*”.

Note: Following the workshop, this proposed framework will be further completed (as required) through collaborative efforts between the ICM members and the PCU, and then taken to the Governments that endorsed the CLME+ SAP for their approval.

SPECIFIC WORKSHOP OBJECTIVES

The Specific Objectives of this workshop are:

SO1: to acquire a common understanding of the rationale behind the SAP M&E Framework (the “why” and “how”), and on the way forward

SO2: to discuss and agree on the timeline for the SAP Monitoring Framework development, endorsement and operationalization process

SO3: to review and clarify, and agree on the methodological sheet to be used in the development of the formal SAP Monitoring Framework

SO4: to further advance, as much as possible, the collaborative development of the formal SAP Monitoring indicator set

- 4.1. to review, and where deemed required or desirable, expand the set of indicators (covering 12 SAP Actions) which were already pre-endorsed by the ICM during 2017, together with their methodological sheets, baseline, current and target indicator values (the latter being new developments)

- 4.2. to review, and where deemed required or desirable, revise and/or expand the set of indicators for the 22 additional SAP actions for which indicators have been developed by the PCU prior to the workshop
- 4.3. to identify and define indicators for 14 SAP Actions for which the inputs from the ICM are deemed **essential (highest priority)**, and - as a minimum - develop methodological sheets and define baseline, targets and current values for 50% of these indicators
- 4.4. to identify and define indicators, for the 29 SAP Actions for which the inputs from the ICM are deemed **beneficial (second-highest priority)** and - as a minimum - develop methodological sheets and define baseline, targets and current values for 30% of these indicators
- 4.5. to further advance, as much as possible, the development of any remaining methodological sheets, baseline, current and target values, for those indicators for which such has not yet been addressed under any of the previous points (**lower priority**)

SO5: to pre-endorse, at the level of the ICM, all SAP indicators developed during and (where applicable) prior to the workshop, as well as any associated available baseline, current and target values

SO6: to jointly agree on, and commit to contribute to the further development, (pre-)endorsement and operationalization of the SAP M&E Framework,
